What have we been learning about?

EARLY YEARS

In Sunflowers this half term our topic has been 'bears'. We have enjoyed various bear related stories including 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt', 'Whatever Next' and 'Where's My Teddy?' We have taken part in some fabulous crafts and re-enactments linked to the topic. We have also enjoyed 'Welly walk Wednesdays' where we have explored the outdoor areas and looked at seasonal changes. EIB 1

(Educational Inclusion Base) EIB1 have worked really hard this half term creating our own moving pictures. We are hoping to finish off our final design this week and create a moving picture of the Gingerbread man story to help with our retelling.

KEY STAGE 1

YEAR 1-

We have been learning all about Nibbles the book monster this half term. We loved exploring the fairytales and we did lots of incredible writing based on Nibbles too! YEAR 3-

Year 3 have had a busy month, we invited Joe into our RE lessons and asked
