### **Behaviour Awards**

Once again this term we have been delighted with the good behaviour of the majority of children in school. **299 pupils have never moved their name from the green zone all term**. These children will be presented with certificates in our celebration assembly. They are a credit to our school and to their families! Congratulations to all these children for setting such a good example to others, making the right choices and keeping our code of conduct consistently throughout the term.

#### **Attendance Awards**

After a year of disappointing attendance outcomes in 2021-22, we have relaunched our attendance policy and come up with a range of new rewards to encourage children and families to support us in our efforts to reach our attendance target. These new rewards have been well received, especially the £5 for 5 days in school each week. The children can't wait for the spin of the wheel during Monday assemblies to see who will win the £5 in each department in school. As detailed in our new attendance policy, we will be awarding a prize (chocolates and a £25 cinema voucher) each half term, to one family of any pupil with 95%+ attendance. The winners will be determined by a spin of our wheel in assembly.

Congratulations to 41 pupils who have had an impressive 100% attendance this term. They are due to be presented with certificates, badges and pencils in our end of term attendance assembly. They will also be invited to attend afternoon tea with me in January. Certificates and badges will also be awarded to another 150 children with good attendance (95% and above).

In total this means that 191 pupils reached our target of 95%+ attendance. This is a great achievement and we could not let this go unrecognised. We will also be awarding badges to several children with greatly improved attendance. Thank you for supporting us to work towards achieving our overall attendance target for the year. This is set at 95% and, to date, our overall attendance figure for this term is 92.25%. I am aware that many children have been unwell this half term and this has had a negative impact on our overall attendance figure. In the spring term we will continue to encourage children to attend as regularly as possible and we will be working with children and families of children whose attendance has been a cause for concern this term. I am sure that you will appreciate the fact that good attendance leads to good achievement in school. For this reason, you are politely requested to refrain from booking holidays during term time, in line with Local Authority guidance. Parents of Y6 pupils, please note that the week beginning May 8th 2023 is Year 6 SATs test week, so please do not book holidays for this week as tests cannot be taken at any other time.

### **End of Term Activities**

Children enjoyed our school Christmas lunch recently on Christmas Jumper Day.

Last Wednesday, all children in school were treated to a fabulous pantomime 'Charlotte's Web' from Altru Theatre Company.

Our Christmas discos were well attended and all the children had a good time. Proceeds from the discos will go towards subsidising our Y6 residential trip as the accommodation and transport costs have risen so much this year that it would have been extremely expensive for us to charge every pupil the full amount.

Before the end of term, all children in school will be taking part in our annual ELF run, which is a sponsored event to raise money for St Johns Hospice, Wirral.

On Monday we are all going to attend church for our Christmas services with Reverend Joe. On Tuesday afternoon we will be providing free parties for all children and I am sure that they will have great fun!
