It was lots of fun. On Thursday we are all going to attend church for our Christmas services with Reverend Joe. On Friday afternoon we will be providing free parties for all children and I am sure that they will have great fun!

#### Attendance Awards

Since the introduction of our new attendance policy and the range of new rewards (to encourage children and families to support us in achieving our attendance target of 95% overall) I am delighted to report that our figures have improved. The rewards have been well received, especially the £5 for 5 days in school each week. The children can't wait for the spin of the wheel during Tuesday assemblies to see who will win the £5 in each department in school. In line with our attendance policy, we have been awarding a prize (chocolates and a £25 cinema voucher) each half term, to one family of any pupil with 95%+ attendance. This half term's winners will be determined by a spin of our wheel in our attendance assembly this week.

**Congratulations to 84 pupils who have had an impressive 100% attendance this term.** They are due to be presented with certificates, badges and pencils in our end of term attendance assembly. They will also be invited to attend afternoon tea with Mrs John in January. Certificates and badges will also be awarded to another **154 children with good attendance (95% and above).** 

In total, this means that 238 pupils reached our target of 95%+ attendance. This is a great achievement and we could not let this go unrecognised. We will also be awarding badges and certificates to 4 children with greatly improved attendance. Thank you for supporting us to work towards achieving our overall attendance target for the year. This is set at 95% and, to date, our overall attendance figure for this term is 93.63%. I am aware that many children have been unwell this half term and this has had a negative impact on our overall attendance figure. In the spring term we will continue to encourage children to attend as regularly as possible and we will be working with children and families of children whose attendance has been a cause for concern this term. I am sure that you will appreciate the fact that <u>good attendance leads to good</u> <u>achievement in school</u>. For this reason, you are politely requested to refrain from booking holidays during term time, in line with Local Authority guidance. Parents of Y6 pupils, please note that the week beginning May 13<sup>th</sup> 2024 is Year 6 SATs test week, so please do not book holidays for this week as tests cannot be taken at any other time.

#### **Behaviour Awards**

We are consistently proud of the children's behaviour and of the fact that we regularly receive positive comments from visitors to school. This term has been no exception and following our Elf Day, the entertainer Freckles) sent me an email. She said that the children's manners and listening skills were fantastic and that entertaining our children 'absolutely made her day'

Not surprisingly, therefore, **285 pupils** have never moved their name from the green zone all term. These children will be presented with certificates in our celebration assembly. They are a real credit to our school and to their families! Congratulations to all these children for setting such a good example to others, making the right choices and keeping our code of conduct consistently throughout the term.
