#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

PE kit is a plain white T-shirt, black shorts and black pumps.

The only jewellery allowed (for safety reasons) are watches and small stud earrings. These should always be removed for PE, to avoid injury.

Hair styles should not be extreme, no dyed hair please and nail varnish/ false nails are not acceptable.

**Please remember** to **label** every item of your child's **school uniform** and PE kit, as it makes it so much easier to locate and return missing items.
