Thanks to all parents and carers who have supported children to attend school as regularly as possible throughout the year. Our overall attendance figure for 2021-2022 is 91.17% which is quite a way from our school target of 95%. However, I am aware that Covid-19 has impacted on this figure and term time holidays have also had a negative impact. From the start of the new term, we will be launching a new attendance strategy which will include several new awards for both families and pupils. Details of our new practices will be sent out in September.

Congratulations to Hugo Hartley-Wilbraham, Leo Ross, Harry Walch, Elise Wilkinson, Libby Dolton and Molly Dolton who have had an impressive 100% attendance this year. They will be presented with certificates and prizes during our end of year attendance assembly, along with termly certificates for excellent, very good and greatly improved attendance.

They took part in a variety of outdoor activities, including paddle boarding, kayaking, sea level traversing and high ropes. They also had a campfire.
